Discussion Questions:

- 1. What did David recognize about God in verse1? (2Corinthians 3:18, Isaiah 43:7)
- 2. David continues with the idea of God's glory in verse 2 (Matthew 19:13-14; 21:15-16, 1 Corinthians 1:27) how is God's glory displayed?
- 3. How is God's greatness and glory revealed in creation of the heavens? (Genesis 1:14-19)
- 4. What significance does God have for man? (verses 4-8) What is unique about the creation of man that is different from everything else God created? (Genesis 1:26-27)
- 5. David starts and ends his Psalm with praise (verses 1,9) during the business of daily life how often do you take time to praise God and contemplate all He has done?
