Discussion Questions:

- 1. The divine warrior (Christ) appears and the final battle and destruction of all his enemies will begin. What worthy names describe Him? (verses 11-12, 16)
- 2. What is the only weapon that Christ has (Isaiah 11:4, 2 Thessalonians 2:8) and how will He rule? (Psalm 2:9)
- 3. Who gathers to make war against the King of kings and Lord of lords? How are they defeated?

Teaching Passage: Revelation 19:11-21

¹¹ Then I saw heaven opened, and behold, a white horse! The one sitting on it is called Faithful and True, and in righteousness he judges and makes war. ¹² His eyes are like a flame of fire, and on his head are many diadems, and he has a name written that no one knows but himself. ¹³ He is clothed in a robe dipped in blood, and the name by which he is called is The Word of God. ¹⁴ And the armies of heaven, arrayed in fine linen, white and pure, were following him on white horses. ¹⁵ From his mouth comes a sharp sword with which to strike down the nations, and he will rule them with a rod of iron. He will tread the winepress of the fury of the wrath of God the Almighty. ¹⁶ On his robe and on his thigh he has a name written, King of kings and Lord of lords.

¹⁷ Then I saw an angel standing in the sun, and with a loud voice he called to all the birds that fly directly overhead, "Come, gather for the great supper of God, ¹⁸ to eat the flesh of kings, the flesh of captains, the flesh of mighty men, the flesh of horses and their riders, and the flesh of all men, both free and slave, both small and great." ¹⁹ And I saw the beast and the kings of the earth with their armies gathered to make war against him who was sitting on the horse and against his army. ²⁰ And the beast was captured, and with it the false prophet who in its presence had done the signs by which he deceived those who had received the mark of the beast and those who worshiped its image. These two were thrown alive into the lake of fire that burns with sulfur. ²¹ And the rest were slain by the sword that came from the mouth of him who was sitting on the horse, and all the birds were gorged with their flesh.

For younger children:

Look at the scene starting in verse 11. The one on the horse is Jesus.


Ask: What names are given to him in verses 11, 13, and 16?

Have you ever heard someone say, "I will take his word for it"? It means that one accepts what someone says with trust. A person can prove to be trustworthy when what they say is true. God has proven he is trustworthy because everything he has said is true.

Ask: Who are some people that you trust? Do you know you can trust God?

Ask: Verse 13 says Jesus is the Word of God. What does it mean to you to accept the Word of God?

When it comes to accepting the Word of God, remember He is perfect, sinless, faithful and trustworthy. He is worthy of our whole trust. Sometimes we might be deceived and forget that we can trust God completely.
