TEACHING PASSAGE: Revelation 22:6-21

Discussion Questions:

1. In the final words of Revelation, there is verification. How are we assured that they are true? (Genesis 1:3, Exodus 20:1, Psalm 12:6, Matthew 24:35 and 1 Peter 1:25)
2. What did Jesus say He would do and when? What is the timeless promise for all believers? (verse 7)
3. What mistake does John repeat (Revelation 19:10)? Who alone deserves worship (Matthew 14:33, John 9:37-38, Hebrews 1:6)? (verses 8-9)
4. How is there an indication that there is little time left for repentance in verses 10-12? (Daniel 12:10, 1 Thessalonians 5:2-4)
5. In verse 13, Jesus makes the statement that solidifies who He is. What does it mean for those that are Christian? (verse 14)
6. The Book of Revelation is not just for the elite or just a few. How do we know this? (verses 16-17)
7. What is the final warning (Revelation 18-19)? What are the results if not taken seriously? (Deuteronomy 4:2; 12:32)
8. The final words extend grace (verse 21). This week thank God for His provision for His people on earth and in heaven.

Teaching Passage: Revelation 22:6-21

⁶ And he said to me, "These words are trustworthy and true. And the Lord, the God of the spirits of the prophets, has sent his angel to show his servants what must soon take place."⁷ "And behold, I am coming soon. Blessed is the one who keeps the words of the prophecy of this book."⁸ I, John, am the one who heard and saw these things. And when I heard and saw them, I fell down to worship at the feet of the angel who showed them to me, ⁹ but he said to me, "You must not do that! I am a fellow servant with you and your brothers the prophets, and with those who keep the words of this book. Worship God."¹⁰ And he said to me, "Do not seal up the words of the prophecy of this book, for the time is near. ¹¹ Let the evildoer still do evil, and the filthy still be filthy, and the righteous still do right, and the holy still be holy."¹² "Behold, I am coming soon, bringing my recompense with me, to repay each one for what he has done. ¹³ I am the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last, the beginning and the end."¹⁴ Blessed are those who wash their robes, so that they may have the right to the tree of life and that they may enter the city by the gates. ¹⁵ Outside are the dogs and sorcerers and the sexually immoral and murderers and idolaters, and everyone who loves and practices falsehood.¹⁶ "I, Jesus, have sent my angel to testify to you about these things for the churches. I am the root and the descendant of David, the bright morning star."¹⁷ The Spirit and the Bride say, "Come." And let the one who hears say, "Come." And let the one who is thirsty come; let the one who desires take the water of life without price.¹⁸ I warn everyone who hears the words of the prophecy of this book: if anyone adds to them, God will add to him the plagues described in this book, ¹⁹ and if anyone takes away from the words of the book of this prophecy, God will take away his share in the tree of life and in the holy city, which are described in this book.²⁰ He who testifies to these things says, "Surely I am coming soon." Amen. Come, Lord Jesus!²¹ The grace of the Lord Jesus be with all. Amen.

For small children:

Ask: How does vs 6 help us trust the Bible? What verse warns us not to change the Bible?

Ask How does Jesus describe himself in vs 13 and 16?

Ask: How many times does Jesus mention he is coming? Why do you think he repeats it?

Ask: In vs 9 John is reminded again not to bow down/worship the messenger, why? And who should we worship?

Ask: Do you sometimes get so excited about good news you hug or high five the person who shared the good news? How can we show God we are thankful for good news? What does it feel like when you get to share good news with others? What is the best news you have ever shared with a friend? How did your friend respond?

Say: Jesus want's us to share the good news of his love for us even while we are still sinners and deserve the punishment of death. John 3:16, "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life." Jesus also wants us to tell others He is coming soon!

Activity: It is time to celebrate the conclusion of studying Revelation! Plan a picnic at a local park or nature preserve. Talk about the things you learned through studying Revelation. How might you live differently as a result of this study?
